



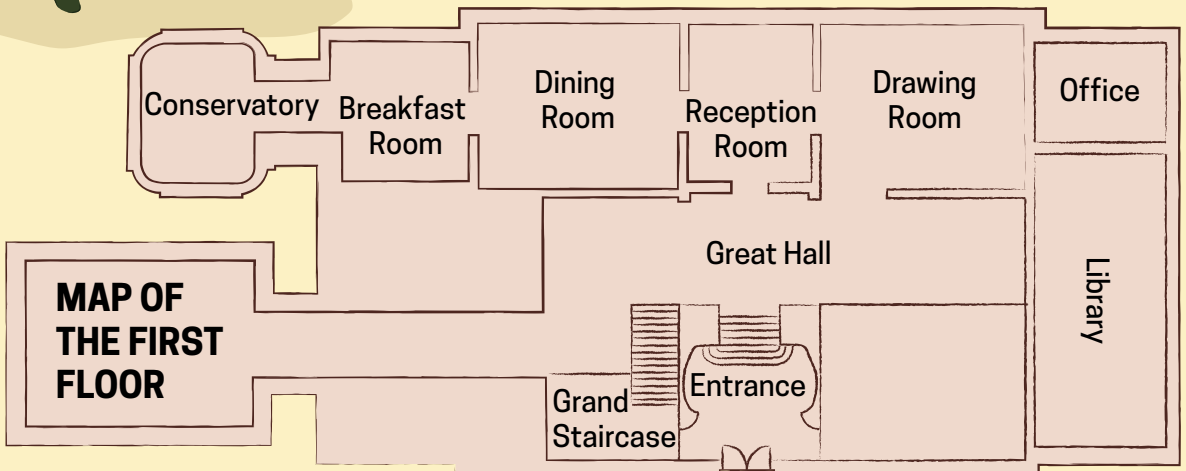
EXPLORE THE CARNEGIE MANSION



Welcome to Cooper Hewitt, Smithsonian Design Museum!

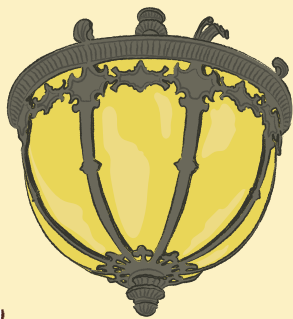
Our museum is in the former home of Andrew Carnegie and his family. Andrew Carnegie found success in the steel business during the late 1800s when railroads were being built.

Hint: Look at the walls along the Grand Staircase.



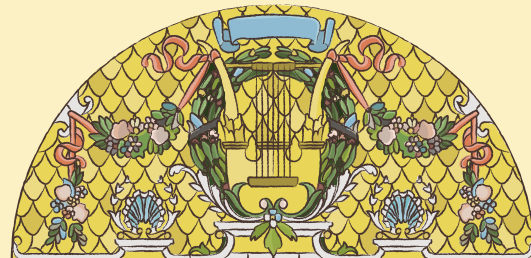
Wooden acorns

Tiffany window

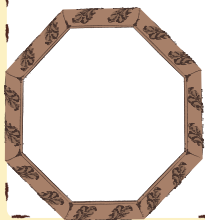
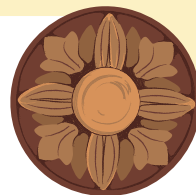
Hint: Look up high in the Reception Room.
